

Vocational Presentations

Vocational presentations are opportunities for RAH members to share about themselves with the entire membership. They allow members to learn, in greater detail, more about a member's personal, work, and family life.

Time limits may vary, but usually vocationals are 10-12 minutes in length. Members are encouraged to incorporate the use of visual aids: PowerPoints, Prezis, videos, photos, etc. Visual aids are not required.

Vocationals may cover:

- Career information, a member's current occupation, their career path, how they got to where they are, etc.
- Education information, their school, degree, major, important moments, etc.
- History, where the member grew up, places they lived, family information, etc.
- Hobbies, interests, passions, what members do for fun, etc.
- Goals, aspirations, long term plans, etc.
- Other fun and interesting things that members think the group would like to know about them

Keep in mind:

- Humor is terrific! Do keep in mind that guests and visiting Rotarians may be present for the presentation as well.
- Members are welcomed to talk about their career and their organizations, but selling shouldn't be included in the presentation. Avoid promoting products, services, or sales.
- Be mindful of the time limit set for your vocational. Many times multiple members are presenting vocationals in the same meeting and need time as well.

Social Media Presentations

Social media presentations are fun, casual, 5 minute presentations that usually occur at one meeting per month. A member is designated as the presenter in advance of the meeting and they compile a presentation (usually a PowerPoint, Prezi, or video) to share with the group.

The presentations cover current events, activities, and updates of RAH members and RAH activities. The presenter may find information to include in the social media presentation from Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter, Instagram, and other online and print sources.

Presentations can be creative and fun, but keep in mind guests and visiting Rotarians may be present at the meeting for the presentation.

Members can always volunteer to be a social media presenter. To volunteer, please notify a member of the RAH board or a member of the Programs and Social committee.
